SAIF Briefing Note: Pacemaker and ICD Defibrillator Removal



Pacemaker and ICD patients are ok for Burial. They do not require either device to be De-activated

Pacemaker must NOT be cremated – simply remove the device beforehand ICD/Defibrillator MUST be De-activated Before its Removed prior to cremation or a Post Mortem

What to do

If you come across a patient with an implanted device, you must identify if it is an ICD or pacemaker.


- · Check with the family or if patient has a device registration card
- GP patient records
- Contact the implanting hospital/ICD clinic

If Pacemaker - ok to remove without further action

If it is known to be an ICD or if any doubt - do not remove the device - contact the implanting hospital or where patient attends ICD clinic

Cardiac Physiologist will liaise with you to attend at earliest convenience to deactivate the device
